

Pseudocrenilabrus philander (Southern mouthbrooder)

Description:

This is a small fish species, normally characterized by nice

coloration ranging from light brown black vertical bars in females and in male's colors differ with locality. Their body usually is a mesh of iridescent blue lower jaw, fin has red tip, black submarginal band and red blocks, anal fin with orange tip and caudal and anal fins have iridescent blue and red blocks. It has a stout body, rounded caudal fin and a small horizontal mouth.

Distribution:

Throughout the north west region

Biology and Ecology:

Occurs in quite a wide variety of habitats ranging from flowing watersto lakes and isolated sinkholes and usually favors vegetated habitats. It preys on insects, shrimps and smaller fish. It breeds from early spring to summer and is a mouthbrooder.



Synodontis macrostoma (*Largemouth squeaker*)

Description:

The Largemouth squeaker is characterized by a very large mouth hence the name

Macrostoma. It also has, amongst others, a long snout, triangular body, dorsal fin tall with a strong spine, pectoral fins with serrated spines, caudal fin deeply forked and mandibular barbels branched, shot and thick.

Distribution:

Okavango Delta, Cunene, Upper Zambezi, Kavango and Kafue river systems.

Biology and Ecology: Nocturnal, inhabits rocky environments, fast flowing waters with vegetation. Feeds on small invertebrates and grazes on algae on rocky surfaces. Spawning occurs in summer during rainy seasons and floods



Hemichromis elongatus (Banded jewelfish)

Description:

The Jewelfish has an attractive colour with the underside of the head and belly being red, black

bars cutting down from dorsal to ventral of the fish along the lateral line, dorsal, anal and caudal fins dark olive, pectoral fins transparent and pelvic fins black. The mouth is terminal and large with distinct two distinctive conical teeth, dorsal fin long and extends to the caudal fin and pelvic fins are far forward just below the pectoral fins.

Distribution:

Okavango Delta, Cunene, Upper Zambezi, Kavango and Upper Congo.

Biology and Ecology: Occurs in littoral riverine habitats and permanent floodplain lagoons with clear water. Feeds on shrimps, insects and small fish. It is a substrate brooder and the parents guard the nest and larvae.



Hepsetus cuvieri (Southern African pike)

Description:

This is a predatory fish species with elongated body, pointed head with jaws and prominent

protruding sharp canine teeth. Dorsal, adipose and anal fins set well back and the caudal fin is forked.

Distribution:

Okavango Delta, Upper Zambezi, Kavango, Cunene, Kafue and Congo river systems.

Biology and Ecology:

It is a top predator usually found in quiet deep water as in channels and lagoons of large floodplains. Juveniles inhabit well vegetated marginal habitats. It is a multiple spawner that breeds in summer. The fertilized eggs are deposited in a foam nest and are guarded by both parents. After hatching the fry drop to the bottom of the nest where they remain attached to the nest feeding on yolk sac and organic detritus.
